

Ozzie and Make Me Records wish to announce the arrival of BERLIN 1990, a new rock opera that recently premiered at Slick Willys in Sacramento. A radio station, two television crews, and a thousand people turned out to see the first New Wave concept program, a mixture of science fiction and history.

The band they came to see has been called "indescribable" (by those in the business of describing) all through their five-year musical career. The five members dress colorfully; play hard, eclectic, or avant-garde rock; write songs about the heroes and anti-heroes of the 20th and 21st Centuries. One of the songs, "Android Love," was #2 in the Sacramento Tune-Dex list.

The program, set in the city of the Cold War and one of the largest nationalist movements in history, chronicles the struggles of the Earth's last city to save itself from the terrors outside its protective atomic barriers. Berliners create, celebrate and bemoan their fates as the forces of death try to gain entry, and the city's final solution is a surprise to all.
